Call for Presentation Abstracts

The ACM Mid-Southeast Chapter Fall Conference provides a forum for discussion of current applications and experimental, theoretical and educational developments in all areas of computing. Faculty and students are invited to contribute an abstract of no more than 300 words to be considered to make either a 20 minute paper presentation or poster presentation addressing a relevant topic.

Student Papers:

Abstracts by students are welcomed. Papers in this category must be **authored and presented** solely by currently enrolled students. Monetary awards and individual plaques will be presented in the following categories: PHD, Masters, Undergraduate 4yr Institutions, and Undergraduate 2yr Institutions. If there are not a minimum of three papers in a category, then that category may be combined with another for award consideration. **All** presenters and authors **must** register for the conference in advance.

Poster Presentations:

Last year was the introduction of poster presentations. Submit an abstract of your poster and please indicate that this is a poster presentation.

The conference will conclude Friday evening with a social hour in the Hospitality Suite at 5 p.m. and then the conference banquet which will include the presentation of awards for student papers.
